- Continue working in your school as a full or part time EA, teacher, or substitute teacher while earning your degree.



O The Clinically-Based Preparation Model

- Coursework tied to classroom practice, theory and practice
- A 2-year immersive experience
- Intensive mentoring/supervising support
- Practicum Placement in School District



O The Clinically-Based Preparation Model

- Practicum placement in a partnership model with local school districts
 - o Allows candidates to teach in their local communities-coursework is online and in-person in the Portland area (not in Corvallis)
- Designed to prepare a more inclusive, racially and linguistically diverse cohort of learners who reflect our communities.
- OSU has been partnering with School Districts since 2015 in this partnership-based model.

OThe Clinically-Based Preparation Model

<u>Year 1:</u>

- 12 hours (BS) or 16 hours (MAT) per week in Practicum Placement
- OSU coursework each term (including summer)

Year 2:

- Flexible plan in partnership with district
 - o Goal: income and mentoring
- Sample:
 - o Fall and Winter term 16 hours per week in placement
 - o Spring Term full time student teaching
 - o OSU coursework each term (including summer)




